A multi-sector partnership that can act with systems and policy changes in support of local solutions.


COMMUNITIES

To tell you how you're doing on the measures that matter, and help you figure out where you might be able to intervene.

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




Regional partnerships will bring together different perspectives to improve health and quality of life in their communities.



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The Value of Regional Collectives?

Develop Strong Governance & Structure

- Manage/coordinate health transformation projects
- Coordinate cross-sector stakeholders for collective action
- Ensure community voice & engagement
- Pooled resources/funding

Action/Support

- Develop and support a Regional Action Plan
- Identification of gaps, prioritize community needs
- Perform system analyses, focusing on big picture & system linkages
- Aggregate resources for transformation projects
- Advocate for policy and system changes
- Pool investment into prioritized community need

Data & Evaluation

- Collect, analyze cross sector data
- Monitor regional performance and measure impact
- Identify efficiencies/savings

Shared Learning Infrastructure

- Foster innovation through crosssector dialogue and action

- Share learnings in a meaningful way




Goal: Integrated and Actionable Data

Make it community-based. CHWs add context to understanding of community need and help generate local solutions.




Cross-sector coalitions tackle systems & policy change to support local action.

Systems Coalitions

So we can make needed systems changes, to support local solutions.

CHW Networks

Authentic community engagement, so we can choose the right things to change together.

Braided Healthcare and Community Data

Results in smarter and more targeted prioritization of community-based strategies.

WORKING TOWARDS REINVESTMENT

HOW IT WORKS TOGETHER

REINVESTMENT

Key cohorts are followed in the data so that impacts and savings can be identified and reinvested for maximum impact.

DATA-DRIVEN STRATEGY

Track suboptimal outcomes. Identify optimal populations, places, or care settings to intervene using multi-sector data-driven strategy.

COALITIONS

Coalitions support local solutions through braided resources, policy, and systems change work.

COMMUNITY

Find out why the patterns you see in the data exist. Leverage local wisdom for solutions.




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Real Time - Shared Agendas in Action

- Infrastructure in schools to support cooking of school meals on site.
- Safe Routes to Schools Program.
- Support E-Cigarette strategies, which restricts access to youth.
- New Medicaid benefit in Washington to cover the case management and tenancy support services outlined in Permanent Supportive Housing











